Perhaps, winter is the only time you can take a rest. Through hard work and perseverance, you can always make sure you and your family have plenty of food to survive during winter.

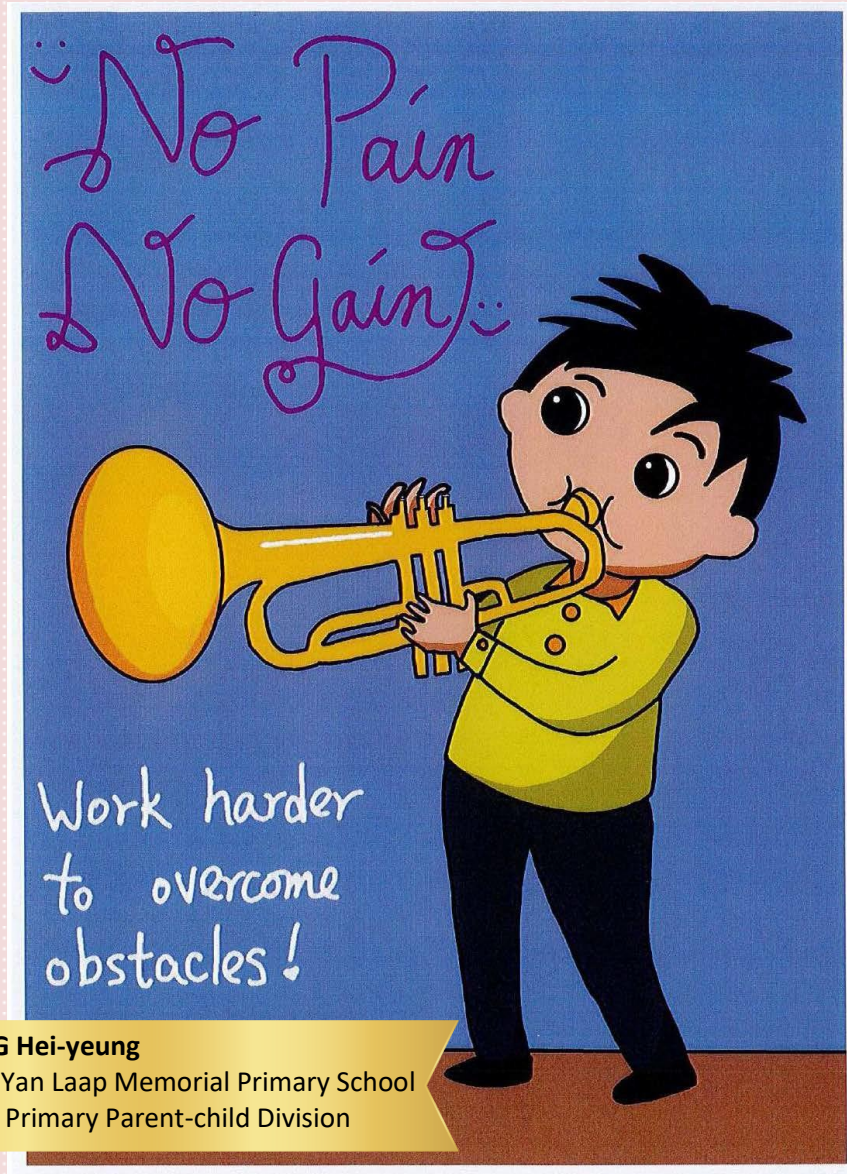
