Jobs for Dogs

Task Description

In this reading activity, students read an information text about four kinds of working dogs the guide dog, the police dog, the sniffer dog and the sheep dog. Students then responded to the related questions.

Preparation


Before the reading activity, the teacher introduced the subject by eliciting students' prior knowledge and personal experience with dogs, a familiar kind of animal to students. The teacher also guided students to predict the content of the text by going through its book cover with students and asking them the following questions:

- Do you like dogs?
- Do you think dogs are our good friends? Why?
- Who is the man on the book cover?
- What can the dogs do for him?
