

SCHOOL EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Redress' educational activities for primary and secondary schools focuses on driving positive behavioural change amongst Hong Kong's youth. From educational talks to upcycling workshops to our annual Get Redressed Month campaign, we aim to partner with schools to engage your students throughout the academic year by teaching them about sustainability, circularity, and current topics around the fashion industry.

Why do we have to educate students about circular fashion?

The fashion industry is one of the most polluting industries in the world. It is accountable for nearly 4% of global greenhouse gas emissions. In Hong Kong, 388 tonnes of textile are landfilled every day, an estimated 50% of which are clothing items. Nurturing a circular mindset in our youth enables them to make conscious and informed choices that contribute to a sustainable fashion lifestyle.

Redress for LIFE WIDE LEARNING

Some of our activities provide an out-of-classroom learning experience. Schools are encouraged to make good use of the Life-Wide Learning Grant to foster students' whole person development with us.

P1-3 6-8yo	Storytelling: Yoyo's and the World's Coolest T-Shirt 30MIN	'Yoyo and the World's Coolest T-Shirt is Hong Kong's first-ever educational comic book about sustainable fashion. Produced by Redress, the story teaches students how they can help reduce their environmental impact by sharing, repairing and upcycling their clothes. We will read excerpts from the book, followed by an interactive quiz to solidify their learning.
P1-6 6-12yo	Talk: How Are Clothes Made? 30MIN	Help students understand that clothes are precious by uncovering the complexity of clothing production and the many resources and work that goes into the process. Students will have opportunities to touch and feel different fibres. The session will also introduce how circular lifestyle habits will extend the precious life of clothing.
P1-6 6-12yo	Talk: More, More, More: Fashion Consumption. 30MIN	Inform students on how extending the life of clothing can critically reduce their negative environmental impact. We will discuss the economic, environmental, and social impacts of overproduction and current consumption habits. We will introduce practical ways to care for our clothes and enjoy wearing them longer.
P4-6 9-12yo	Talk: Climate Crisis & Environmental Impact. 30MIN	Introduce the concept of circular fashion as a solution to reduce waste. While uncovering how the fashion industry contributes to the climate crisis, we will discuss the source of greenhouse gas emissions and the consumption of energy and natural resources required in the making of clothes. As we explore the impact and result of climate change locally and globally, we will also see how circular lifestyle habits help reduce environmental impact.
P4-6 9-12yo	Workshop: Upcycling T-shirt Tote bag 60MIN	Redress facilitators will guide students in making a no-sew tote bag from an old T-shirt, fostering sustainable behaviours from a young age. Yoyo and the World's Coolest T-Shirt is Hong Kong's first-ever educational comic book about sustainable fashion. Produced by Redress, the story teaches students how they can reduce their environmental impact by sharing, repairing and upcycling their clothes. Please note that a storytime session is not included. To ensure a smooth running of this workshop, teachers are advised to read the book or play the read-along video from our website in advance.

F1-6 12-18yo	Talk: Climate Crisis & Environmental Impact 30MIN	Introduce how the fashion industry contributes to the climate crisis. We will discuss the source of greenhouse gas emissions and the consumption of energy and natural resources required in the making of clothes. We will explore the impact and result of climate change locally and globally, introduce the concept and principles of circular fashion as a solution to reduce waste, and explain how circular lifestyle habits reduce environmental impact.
F4-6 15-18yo	Talk: See Beyond the Price Tag! 30MIN	Shows students how to become more responsible consumers by buying better through understanding what goes into clothes pricing, how marketing drives consumption, and how to differentiate authentic claims from greenwashing. We will learn about sustainable fashion products through identifying better materials, production procedures, and sustainable brand services.
F1-6 12-18yo	Workshop: Denim Boardgame 60MIN	This workshop uses a fun and original board game to show students the role and power of each stakeholder in denim production and consumption on a global scale. Students will discuss the behind-the- scenes process of designing and manufacturing jeans, and be exposed to the many options and decisions involved in the supply chain.
F4-6 15-18yo	Workshop: Mend & Trend 120MIN	This workshop teaches students how to extend the life of clothing items through fun sewing skills to repair and enhance clothing so they become trendy: 1) sewing a button, and 2) patching a hole. Students should bring in a pair of socks to work on. All other materials will be provided.
F4-6 15-18yo	Workshop: Warehouse Visit & Clothes Sorting 120MIN	This workshop brings students to our warehouse to sort clothes, seeing firsthand the waste of fast fashion, overproduction, and overconsumption. We will share about Redress' work including our Takeback Programme and its beneficiaries, and the volume of clothes we receive monthly. Students will gain hands-on experience in examining and sorting clothes according to the categories of resale, donation, and downcycling.

Get Redressed Month

FOR ALL LEVELS

Since its launch in 2018, Get Redressed Month has been Hong Kong's largest consumer awareness campaign about circular fashion. Organised by Redress, this local, annual, month-long campaign gathered 120+ corporates, clubs, organisations and schools in 2024 to raise awareness about the environmental impact of our clothing choices and shift attitudes and habits towards reducing clothing waste. Schools can join for FREE by setting up their own clothing drive in May 2025 and receiving an educational talk on the theme of the year.
