Fundraising Activities and Method of Participation

I. FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

1. Cleaning for Charity, Hiking for Charity and Green Acts for Charity

i) Cleaning for Charity

- Participating schools may choose their own sites for conducting the Cleaning for Charity activity.
- The activity may take place in schools, elderly homes or other places in the community. Schools should also encourage students to support the fundraising activities by cleaning their own homes and soliciting donations from principals, teachers, classmates, parents, relatives, friends, companies, etc. Schools may decide on the number of service hours, type of service and criteria for sponsorship.

ii) Hiking for Charity

- Participating schools may choose a suitable and safe hiking route on their own for conducting the Hiking for Charity activity. They may refer to the trail information provided on the website of the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) (https://www.hiking.gov.hk/trail).
- Participating schools may engage principals, teachers, alumni and/or parents in the hiking trip to help students acquire a better understanding of nature and enhance their awareness of environmental protection. Schools may decide on the criteria for sponsorship.
- If the hiking is to be conducted at a location managed by AFCD, schools are required to complete the "Notification of Hiking for Charity" form (available from The Community Chest) and return it to the Police Station of the respective district. Schools are also required to read the "Guidelines on Outdoor Activities" of the Education Bureau (website: https://www.edb.gov.hk/en/ → School Administration and Management → Administration → About Activities → School Activities Guidelines).

iii) Green Acts for Charity

Participating schools can organise a variety of "green" fundraising activities, such as second-hand clothing fashion show; recycling bag design competition; recycling program; DIY reused cutlery; reusable lamps, eco-friendly soap or hand sanitizers, enzyme cleaner workshops; eco-friendly sports competition and energy saving competition; use food waste to make fertilizer; DIY recycled plastic bottle planters, and use flower seedlings provided by The Community Chest for charity sales etc.

Green Acts To-do List:

Second-hand Clothing Fashion Show

The event aims to promote sustainable living which is related to the earth's ecosystem by redesigning old clothes. Students can cut and redesign second-hand clothes, and also adopt Ocean Ecology as a theme. Students are required to explain the messages behind each costume so as to enable them to further comprehend the importance of environmental conservation.



DIY Cutlery Workshop

The activity aims to encourage students to bring their cutlery and cultivate their "plastic-free" habits. DIY cutlery bag workshop and wood carving class can be organised. Students can bring their own thick and cleaned old clothes to use as fabric materials. Students can use their own carved cutlery during lunchtime at school.

Green Airplane Race

The activity aims to encourage students to be creative in their daily lives and reduce waste through waste recycling. Students have to create "green" airplanes for competition by reusing disposable plastic bottles and paper rolls. A post-event exhibition can be organised to showcase participants' artwork and inspire more students with the idea of "waste recycling".

• Schools may decide on the criteria for sponsorship.

2. Charity Plant Sale

- **CYC member schools** that wish to join the Charity Plant Sale may refer to the details to be announced by the respective CYC District Executive Committees at a later stage.
- Non-CYC member schools may organise and hold their own sale activities.
- Schools may either plant the seedlings provided by The Community Chest or produce velvet/silk/paper flowers for charity sale or auction.

II. HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- All schools are welcome to enrol in the activities. Donations may be sought from principals, teachers, alumni, parents, relatives, friends, companies, etc.
- Emphasis should be placed on the educational value of the fundraising activities. Participants are encouraged to show care for the environment and the community and are expected to do their best to raise funds.
- Participating schools may organise the above-mentioned fundraising activities between **November 2024 and February 2025**.
- All of the above fundraising activities can be organised on a class, whole school or joint school basis.
- We strongly encourage schools or students to take pictures or videos of their activities which could be shared with The Community Chest to promote the event "Greening for the Chest".

CYC member schools

- Details will be separately announced by the respective CYC District Executive Committees at a later stage.
- The CYC member schools may apply for a financial subsidy from the CYC Office. Originals of relevant quotation documents and receipts should be sent to the CYC Office with completed CYC application forms for financial subsidy and reimbursement. Application forms can be downloaded from the CYC website (https://www.edb.gov.hk/cyc Financial Subsidy for CYC Activities).

Gold Award: Schools with total amount of funds raised reaching or exceeding HK\$80,000 Silver Award: Schools with total amount of funds raised between HK\$50,000 and HK\$79,999 Bronze Award: Schools with total amount of funds raised between HK\$30,000 and HK\$49,999

- 1. "Top Fundraising CYC District Award" : Champion, 1st and 2nd Runners-up
- 2. "The Best Progress Fundraising CYC District Award": Champion, 1st and 2nd Runners-up
- 3. "Top Fundraising Special School Award"

IV. POINTS TO NOTE AND COLLECTION OF DONATION

- All funds raised through "Greening for the Chest" 2024/25 will be designated to benefit "Children and Youth services" supported by The Community Chest. All funds collected under "Greening for the Chest" should go to The Community Chest of Hong Kong and not for other purposes.
