## Be vigilant against vaccine preventable diseases

We would like to take this opportunity to urge you to keep vigilant against vaccine preventable diseases (such as measles and pertussis) at schools; and to remind parents to keep vaccinations of their children up-to-date to protect themselves against these infectious diseases.

The global immunisation coverage rates have dropped since the COVID-19 pandemic and many countries worldwide are facing a resurgence of measles and pertussis outbreaks. In Hong Kong, an increase in the number of measles and pertussis cases is also observed. According to the latest local surveillance data (as of 23 May 2024), 8 measles cases and 28 pertussis cases are recorded, exceeding the total number of cases, i.e. 3 cases and 15 cases respectively, recorded in whole year of 2023.

Vaccination is the most effective way to prevent measles, pertussis as well as other vaccine preventable diseases (such as chickenpox and pneumococcal diseases). In this regard, we would like to enlist your help to remind parents to maintain upto-date immunisation for their children for timely and comprehensive protection as delay in vaccination will weaken the protection for the children against relevant infectious diseases. To prevent outbreaks of measles, pertussis and other respiratory infections, students/children who develop skin rash, fever and acute respiratory symptoms are strongly advised not to attend school and should seek medical advice. The CHP will give advice on the management of the cases and take appropriate control measures.
